

NAVY TRAINING AT THE ALAMO

LACKLAND AFB, Texas – Staff and students from Naval Technical Training Center (NTTC) Lackland Air Force Base, Texas, participated in a special celebration Navy Day at the Alamo in San Antonio April 22. The city's annual fiesta celebration featured music by the Navy Band New Orleans Express, displays from the Naval School of Health Sciences Detachment San Diego, Fort Sam Houston, Navy Recruiting District San Antonio, Navy Marine Corps Reserve Training Center, and USS SAN ANTONIO (LPD 17), as well as practical demonstrations by the staff and students of NTTC, including a brief overview of the Culinary Specialist rating and a tasting for visitors.

Additionally, the Master at Arms and Law Enforcement Academies demonstrated physical apprehension restraint techniques, and the Navy Corrections Academy featured their emergency control team. The team of three instructors and three students in full riot gear with batons and face masks demonstrated crowd and riot control procedures. A final law enforcement demonstration featured the popular Military Working Dog teams demonstrating controlled aggression.

“This is a great opportunity to come into the community and showcase Navy training and tactics to the people who support us and really be a part of the community, not just an occupant, or part-time resident,” said NTTC Executive Officer Lt. Cmdr. Jay Drake, celebration master of ceremonies.
