

Stand up of crypto center onboard Corry

The 14,000 members of the Navy's Cryptologic community took a step forward with the establishment of the Center for Cryptology at Corry Station in a ceremony this past week.

The center is tasked with working directly with the fleet in defining all curriculum, educational tools and professional development for all cryptologists and electronic warfare technician ratings and ranks.

The Learning Center, one of several being established throughout the fleet, is the product of the revolution in training, the Chief of Naval Operations' vision to enhance operational

readiness and increase successful mission accomplishment by creating an environment of lifelong learning to support the growth and development of Sailors.

"We are aggressively transforming naval cryptology. Key to that transformation is shaping the Navy's CTs and EWs to meet the demands of Seapower 21 and the information age," Rear Adm. Joe Burns, Commander Naval Security Group Command, who oversees all naval cryptologists and former commanding officer of Corry Station, said. "We can't achieve that goal with the Center of Cryptology."
